First Platoon

Enforcement Efforts

First Platoon

- 1st Shift Blue Platoon officers cited 1 drivers for driving with license suspended.
- 1st Shift Green Platoon officers cited 7 drivers for driving with license suspended.

Second Platoon

- 2nd Shift Blue Platoon officers arrested 8 drivers for operating while impaired.
- 2nd Shift Green Platoon officers arrested 5 drivers for operating while impaired.
- 2nd Shift Blue Platoon officers cited 8 drivers for driving with license suspended.
- 2nd Shift Green Platoon officers cited 8 drivers driving with license suspended.

Quality of Life Action Plan

First Platoon

- 1st Shift Blue Platoon completed a Noise Detail and observed no violations.
- 1st Shift Blue Platoon completed 6 hours and 45 minutes of park checks.
- 1st Shift Green Platoon completed a noise detail with two traffic stops conducted, 1 driving with license suspended, 1 loud car stereo and a verbal warning issued.
- 1st Shift Green Platoon completed 8 hours and 51 minutes of park checks.

Second Platoon

- 2nd Shift Blue Platoon completed 2 Noise Details and cited 8 drives for noise ordinance violations. A total of 15 noise violations were issued during the month.
- 2nd Shift Blue Platoon completed 21 hours and 17 minutes of park checks.
- 2nd Shift Green Platoon completed 3 Noise Details and cited 6 drivers for noise ordinance violations. A total of 13 noise violation citations were issued during the month.
- 2nd Shift Green Platoon completed 14 hours and 50 minutes of park checks.

Crime Suppression Efforts





Fire Operations Division



Operational Assignments

- Pre-surveys: 36 pre-surveys were completed for businesses within our jurisdiction. The pre-surveys are being sent to Bay County Central Dispatch to be entered into the mapping feature on the iPads onboard the fire apparatus.
- Vehicle Maintenance: Aerial 1 remains out of service and is expected to be back in service within one month for engine repair, anti-freeze in oil.
- Small tools/Equipment Maintenance: Annual service was conducted on extrication equipment.
- Building Maintenance: The station alarm system was upgraded by Anderson Radio.
- Self- Contained Breathing Apparatus (SCBA): 15 SCBA cylinders were filled.
- City- Owned Automatic External Defibrillators (AED's): All city-owned AED's were accounted for and verified that they are operational and charged.
- Child Car Seat Inspections/Installations: A total of 20 child safety seats were installed in the month of June.
- Uniforms/Personal Protective Equipment (PPE): An order was received and shall consist of two short sleeve shirts and two pairs of pants for each employee. We have begun the 2016-

2017 cycle of Personal Protective Equipment inspections and repairs. The first round of PPE has been shipped to Turnout Gear Management, Inc.

- Water/Ice Rescue: The boat motor was run on every Saturday and rescue equipment was checked out.
- Emergency Medical Services (EMS): An Emergency Medical Services (EMS) Quality Assurance Audit was conducted on EMS Incident Reports for the month of May 2016.
- Supplies: Cleaning supplies were ordered for all four fire stations.
- Hose and Hydrants: Yearly hose testing is being conducted to comply with National Fire Protection Association (NFPA) standards for hose.
- SDS Sheets: All station SDS location sheets have been updated.
- Radios: No report for the month of June.

Quality Service Opportunities

- 3 Self- Contained Breathing Apparatus (SCBA) air cylinders were filled for the River Roar Rescue Crew.

MUTUAL AID

- There was no Mutual Aid provided for the month of June.

Regional Response Team 31/TECHNICAL RESCUE TEAM

- On June 28th a Lieutenant and an Engineer/Driver attended a Team Leader Region 3 Regional Response Team 31/Technical Rescue Team at the Midland City Fire Department Station #1.

Fire Marshal

- Inspections – 58 inspections were conducted.
- Investigations – Five fire related investigations were conducted.
- Smoke Detector – Replaced 2 smoke detector batteries for residents.
- Juvenile Fire Setter Program: Two juveniles were counseled concerning fire safety.

Fire Incidents Investigated

During the month of June 2016 there were five fire incidents investigated.

- On June 8th, several small newspaper fires were set in the area of Park and Helen. Investigated by the Fire Marshal.
- On June 17th, a boat fire on Loessel was investigated. Investigated by the Fire Marshal.
- On June 21st, an outside rubbish fire was investigated by the Fire Marshal.
- On June 22nd, a structure fire on Lincoln was investigated. Investigated by the Fire Marshal.
- On June 27th, a structure fire on Chilson was investigated, it remains under investigation. Invested by the Fire Marshall and a Detective.

Departmental Training

Fire Operations

- On June 2nd, 6th, 13th, 16th, 20th, and 23rd, Full- time Firefighters, Public Safety Officers, and Part –Time Paid on Call Firefighters attended eight hour training days on the following topics: Apparatus Driving, Apparatus Pumping, Search and Rescue, Hydrant Connection, Hose Evolutions, and Ladder Evolutions.
