Quality Service Opportunities

First Platoon

- On July 18th, officers from 1st Shift Green Platoon assisted an elderly couple who were lost on the west side of the city.

Second Platoon

- None.

Other Agency Assist

First Platoon

- 1st Shift Green Platoon assisted Hampton Township Police Department with a personal injury accident that occurred on July 18th on Center Ave.

Second Platoon

- 2nd Shift Blue Platoon assisted Bay County Sheriff's Deputies on July 31st, at a location on Jackson St and a location on Tuscola Rd. Bay County Sheriff's Deputies were investigating a larceny of firearms and other property. Over \$9,000 of stolen property was recovered and two subjects were arrested.

Enforcement Efforts

First Platoon

- On July 4th, a Corporal investigated a larceny of a purse from an elderly person at the McDonald's on Cass Ave. After reviewing surveillance video, he patrolled the area and located the suspect vehicle on a side street. This led to the identity of the suspect and criminal charges are pending.
- On July 18th, a Public Safety Officer stopped a subject walking on McLellan St and 16th Street with an open can of alcohol. They cited this subject and arrested the subject they were with for two misdemeanor warrants.
- On July 19th, an Officer in Training and a Public Safety Officer stopped a vehicle at the McDonald's on Cass Ave. They determined the driver was under the influence of drugs and was arrested to Operating While Intoxicated- Drugs.
- On July 24th, a Public Safety Officer stopped a vehicle for Improper Plate. The driver was arrested for No Insurance and two misdemeanor warrants.

Second Platoon

- On July 7th, a Public Safety Officer stopped a vehicle for weaving/erratic driving. The driver was arrested for Operating While Intoxicated.
- On July 12th, a Public Safety Officer stopped a vehicle for driving without lights on. The driver was cited for Driving with License Suspended and arrested for outstanding warrants.
- On July 19th, a Public Safety Officer was checking a building when a vehicle pulled into the parking lot. He made contact with the driver and ultimately arrested him for felony Operating While Intoxicated 3rd Offense.
- On July 20th, a Public Safety Officer located an intoxicated subject in Defoe Park that was on probation. He completed a report and sent it to this subject's probation officer for the violation.
- On July 23rd, a Public Safety Officer stopped a vehicle for an equipment violation. The driver was arrested for Operating While Intoxicated and also charged with Possession of Marijuana.
- On July 23rd, a Public Safety Officer stopped a vehicle for Improper Passing. The driver was arrested on 3 outstanding warrants and also charged with Driving with License Suspended 2nd Offense.
- On July 29th, a Public Safety Officer stopped a vehicle for no lights. The driver was cited for Driving with License Suspended and a Noise Violation for a loud muffler.
- On July 31st, a Law Enforcement Officer located four juveniles near Dean/Jane St. Two of these juveniles were on probation and were in possession of a Marijuana pipe. Probate would not approved lodging them for the violations. They were turned over to their parents and a report was sent to probate.

Quality of Life Action Plan

First Platoon

- 1st Shift Blue Platoon completed a Noise Detail and observed no violations.
- 1st Shift Blue Platoon completed 7 hours and 39 minutes of park checks.
- 1st Shift Green Platoon completed a Noise Detail and observed no violations.
- 1st Shift Green Platoon completed 9 hours and 21 minutes of park checks.

Second Platoon

- 2nd Shift Blue Platoon completed 1 Noise Detail and cited 3 drivers for noise ordinance violations.
- 2nd Shift Blue Platoon completed 16 hours and 17 minutes of park checks.
- 2nd Shift Green Platoon completed 1 Noise Details and cited 1 driver for noise ordinance violations. A total of 5 noise violation citations were issued during the month.
- 2nd Shift Green Platoon completed 8 hours and 47 minutes of park checks.

Traffic Enforcement Efforts

First Platoon

- 1st Shift Green Platoon officers conducted a traffic detail on July 28th for 30 minutes at Columbus and Madison there was 1 traffic stop for an expired registration.
- 1st Shift Blue Platoon officers conducted a traffic detail on AuSable State Rd for one hour, there were no violation observed.
- 1st Shift Blue Platoon officers worked traffic enforcement while on patrol for a total of 21 hours. The areas of enforcement included 7th St. & Saginaw St., Thomas St. & Wenona St., Henry St. & Hart St., Cass Ave. & Broadway Ave., Independence Bridge, Madison Ave. and AuSable State Rd.

- 1st Shift Green Platoon officers worked traffic enforcement while on patrol for a total of over 12 hours. The areas of enforcement included Henry St., Hart St., Water St. & 19th St., Saginaw St. & 7th St., John F. Kennedy Drive & Midland St., and Warner St.

Second Platoon

- 2nd Shift Blue Platoon officers worked a traffic detail in different areas throughout the city. Three noise violations were cited and no speed violations were observed.
- 2nd Shift Green Platoon officers worked a traffic detail in the area of Veteran's Memorial Bridge. One Loud Car Stereo citation was issued along with five speeding citations.
- 2nd Shift Blue Platoon officers worked traffic enforcement while on patrol for a total of 17 hours 11 minutes. The areas of enforcement included Henry St., Midland St., Michigan Ave., Independence Bridge, Columbus Ave., and McKinley Ave.
- 2nd Shift Green Platoon officers worked traffic enforcement while on patrol for a total of 12 hours 47 minutes. The areas of enforcement included Euclid Ave., N. Union St., Woodside Ave., Madison Ave., Center Ave., Lincoln Ave., Johnson St., McKinley Ave., Midland St., Independence Bridge and Walnut St.

Crime Suppression Efforts

First Platoon

- Officers spent time checking parks, including checking Infinity Skate Park for bikes and scooters in the park.
- Officers spent time checking for loud car stereos/noise violations.
- Officers spent time enforcing traffic at high crash intersections.
- Officers checked businesses on weekends and before they open during the week.

Second Platoon

- Officers completed 32 Park/Area checks totaling approximately 25 hours and 4 minutes.
- Officers completed 288 actions of "Appeared Secure" for building checks and some used as park checks. Officers recorded 16 business checks with door hangars left totaling approximately 18 hours and 5 minutes spent on building checks.
- Officers are continuing to do C.O.P. (Community Oriented Policing) stops nightly, totaling 104 for the month.

RESERVE UNIT ACTIVITY

- Reserve Officers conducted one Riverwalk Detail and issued five warnings for Curfew Violation.
- Reserve Officers worked 220 volunteer hours during the Fireworks Festival.
- Reserve Officers worked the Bay City Pride event in Veteran's Memorial Park.

Support Operations Division

Detective Bureau Recap

Exceptional Cases Investigated or Cleared by Arrest:

- The Detective Bureau investigated a Breaking & Entering where a man allowed an acquaintance to stay at his home for a few days. The man found that over \$800 in electronics had been stolen by his acquaintance. The Detective Bureau located the stolen items in BWI,

recovered them at the pawnshop and turned them over to the victim. They then attempted to locate the suspect with nil results. The Prosecutor's Office issued a two count felony warrant for the suspect for home invasion and larceny in a building.

- The Detective Bureau investigated a counterfeit money case where a man entered a local gas station and passed a phony \$100 bill. The Detective Bureau reviewed the surveillance video and recognized the suspect. To validate the name of the suspect they compared the image to a booking photo of him and confirmed that he had the correct name. The Detective Bureau also showed the video image to the suspect's father and he confirmed that it was indeed his son. They attempted to locate the suspect with nil results. The Bay County Prosecutor's Office issued a felony warrant for the suspect.
- The Detective Bureau investigated a larceny/uttering and publishing case where a man had checks stolen from his home and then cashed totaling \$6000.00. The Detective Bureau had to procure a search warrant to obtain the bank records and video surveillance from the bank. The Detective Bureau obtained the video and made a still image of the suspect cashing the checks. They showed the victim the image and he identified him as his grandson. The man declined to press charges against his grandson.

Quality Service Opportunities

- The Detective Bureau investigated a counterfeit case where two young males entered a store and passed a \$100 bill that was stamped "For Motion Picture Use Only". They turned the case over to the Secret Service.





Fire Operations Division



Operational Assignments

- Pre- surveys: 33 pre –surveys were completed for businesses within our jurisdiction. The pre – surveys are being sent to Bay County Central Dispatch to be entered in to the mapping feature on the iPads onboard the fire apparatus.
- Vehicle Maintenance: Aerial 1 was placed back into service. Aerial 1 is experiencing intermittent fuel injector/fuel line issues which is being attempted to identify and repair.
- Small Tools/Equipment Maintenance: The cutting blades on the Genesis Cutters were damaged at a structure fire on July 23rd on Sherman and the manufacturer has been contacted to conduct necessary repairs.
- Building Maintenance: The rear entry door at Station 2 was replaced. The outside lighting at Station 1 is being repaired by Clements Electric. Two exterior doors were repaired at Station 1. Several emergency lighting fixtures at fire stations were found to have dead batteries and were replaced.
- Self- Contained Breathing Apparatus (SCBA): 27 SCBA cylinders were filled. The cascade system had an electrical problem which included two fuses being blown in the electrical supply panel and a breaker tripped inside the cascade system. The fuses were repaired by

our electrical repair contractor, and the breaker was reset by us with instruction from West Shore. It is unknown what caused these issues. West Shore also recommended that the cascade system be kept “on” all the time, instead of shutting the system off when not in use.

- City- Owned Automatic External Defibrillators (AEDs): All city owned AED’s were accounted for and verified that they are operational and charged.
- Child Care Seat Inspection/Installation: A total of five child safety seats were installed in the month of July. During each installation, caregivers are educated as to the proper way to safely harness the child in their seat, the dangers that loose items in their vehicles can pose, becoming projectiles in an accident, and the next steps to take when their child outgrows their current car seat.
- Uniforms/Personal Protective Equipment (PPE): We are continuing the 2016-2017 cycle of Personal Protective Equipment inspections and repairs. The first round of Personal Protective Equipment has been shipped to Turnout Gear Management, Inc.
- Water/Ice Rescue: The boat motor was run on every Saturday and rescue equipment was checked out.
- Emergency Medical Services (EMS): An Emergency Medical Services Quality Assurance Audit was conducted on EMS Incident Reports for the month of June 2016. Necessary supplies were ordered throughout the month.
- Supplies: Cleaning supplies were ordered for all four fire stations.
- Hose and Hydrants: Yearly hose testing is being conducted to comply with National Fire Protection Association Standards for Hose.
- Safety Data Sheets (SDS): New Safety Data Sheets have been obtained for the Diesel Exhaust Fluid (DEF) that is being used in the new HME apparatus.
- Radios: No report for the month of May.

MUTUAL AID

- There was no Mutual Aid provided during the month of July.

Fire Marshal

- Inspections – 52 inspections were conducted.
- Investigations – 3 fire related investigations were conducted.
- Smoke Detector – 5 smoke detectors were installed for residents.
- Fire Extinguisher Classes – 1 class for Acra Cast on 1st St. was conducted for 15 employees.
- Fire Prevention Program – 1 program was conducted at the Boys and Girls Club for 50 kids.

Fire Incidents Investigated

During the month of July 2016 there were three fire incidents investigated.

- On July 2nd, a structure fire on Sherman was investigated. The cause was undetermined. Investigated by the Fire Marshal and a Detective.
- On July 14th, a structure on Sheridan was investigated. The cause was undetermined. Investigated by the Fire Marshal and a Detective.
- On July 23rd, a structure on Sherman was investigated and remains under investigation. Investigated by a Michigan State Police Fire Investigator.

Departmental Training

Fire Operations

- On July 7th, Fire Division personnel conducted training on a high capacity water pump that the City Service Building has in case we needed it during the Tall Ships Festival.
- On July 15th, the Fire Operations Division conducted a Post Incident Analysis of the structure fire on S. Sherman on July 2nd.
- On July 15th, 16th, and 17th, Fire Division personnel toured the Tall Ships Festival and Tall Ships to familiarize themselves with access to the event, location of the ships, crews from each ship and the ships themselves should there be an incident response to the festival.
- On July 21st and 22nd Fire Division personnel conducted training on the new HME apparatus, training was led by a representative from HME.
- On July 27th, the fire Operations Division conducted a Post Incident Analysis of the structure fire on Sheridan St. on July 14th.
