Quality Service Opportunities

First Platoon

- A Public Safety Officer took an out of state drive to District Court for a civil infraction hearing after a property traffic crash. The driver had been on their way to the airport so the Public Safety Officer took all of her luggage with them and called a taxi for her upon the conclusion of the hearing.
- A city resident was in their yard raking leaves when an Officer in Training and a Public Safety Officer arrived to inform her of her 21 year old son's passing. After family members began to arrive the Officer in Training finished raking her leaves.

Second Platoon

- A Public Safety Officer assisted the Delta College Police Academy by acting as an evaluator/instructor for two days of scenario training.
- A Sergeant and two Public Safety Officers investigated a Hit and Run accident. The victims were not from Bay City and their vehicle was not able to be driven. They had just completed their grocery shopping for Thanksgiving. The family of 4 was transported with their groceries to the station where they waited for another family member to come pick them up.

Other Agency Assist

First Platoon

- On November 11, 2016 officers checked multiple residences for a suspect with multiple warrants at the request of the Midland Police Department.
- On November 13, 2016, officers assisted with a Hit and Run investigation on Euclid Avenue. They held a scene until a Michigan State Police unit could arrive to investigate it.
- On November 20, 2016, a corporal and an officer assisted Michigan State Police with a Property Damage Crash at Euclid Ave. & Mosher St.
- On November 25, 2016, the Midland Police Department requested we check a few stores for unreported Retail Frauds after they had located subjects who had items from a Bay City Family Dollar. A Public Safety Officer located the correct store, took a Retail Fraud Complaint, and lodged a subject for the offense.

Second Platoon

- On November 5, 2016, officers assisted the Michigan State Police with traffic control and establishing a perimeter while they were pursuing a vehicle in the city limits.
- On November 18, 2016, officers assisted Hampton Township Police Department with apprehending a suspect that fled on foot from Meijer on Pine Rd.

Enforcement Efforts

First Platoon

- On November 8, 2016, a Public Safety Officer spoke with a suspect in a home invasion complaint he was able to obtain a confession from the suspect who implicated his accomplices. A lieutenant and another Public Safety Officer were able to locate one of the suspects who the initial Public Safety Officer interviews and obtained a confession from him.
- A Public Safety Officer stopped a vehicle because the driver had a suspended operator's license. It was determined that the driver of the vehicle was operating under the influence of marijuana. After they were arrested, the Public Safety Officer conducted an inventory search of the vehicle and located some additional marijuana.

Second Platoon

- On November 7th, 2016, a Lieutenant and a Public Safety Officer stopped a subject on a bike who they knew to have a felony warrant. The suspect was searched incident to arrest and was found to have crack cocaine and marijuana in his possession. He was charged with possession of both items in addition to the original felony charge.
- On November 19, 2016 officers followed up on a Domestic Assault that occurred during the day shift. Officers were able to locate the suspect's father and obtained a current cell phone number for him and a friend that he hangs out with. The address of the friend was located, officers spoke with the homeowner and learned that the suspect was hiding in the house. He was located and taken into custody without incident.

Traffic Enforcement Efforts

First Platoon

- Officers worked traffic enforcement while on patrol for a total of 13 hours working the following areas: Marquette Ave and Hart St., Cass Ave. and Broadway Ave., State St. and Smith St., and around Linsday and Kolb Elementary Schools.

Second Platoon

- Officers worked traffic enforcement while on patrol for a total of 35 hours and 59 minutes working the following areas: Broadway Ave., Columbus Ave., Washington Ave., Center Ave., Thomas St., Midland St., Wenona Ave., Lafayette Ave., Independence Bridge, Cass Ave., Kosciuszko Ave., Farragut St., Water St., Marquette Ave., and Henry St.

Crime Suppression Efforts

First Platoon

- Officers completed 100 park checks, totaling approximately 13 hours and 5 minutes.
- Officers completed 37 actions of “Appeared Secure” for building checks. Officers left door hangers at a total of 21 businesses. Officers recorded business checks totaling approximately 4 hours and 48 minutes spent on checks.
- Officers continued to complete C.O.P. (community oriented policing) stops during their shift.

Second Platoon

- Officers completed 215 park checks, totaling approximately 39 hours and 36 minutes.
- Officers completed 488 actions of “appeared secure” for building checks. Officers left door hangers at a total of 230 businesses. Officers recorded business checks totaling approximately 31 hours and 25 minutes spent on checks.
- Officers are continuing to do C.O.P. (community oriented policing) stops during their shift, totaling 123 for the month.

Reserve Unit Activity

- Reserve officers worked two Riverwalk Details.
 - Two juveniles were contacted for curfew and released to their parents.
 - One citation for squealing tires was issued.
 - A reserve officer worked with PSO Pashak at the Santa arrival in Wenona Park.
 - Background investigations were completed on new reserve applicants.
 - Six new candidates were accepted to the unit to begin training in January.





Fire Operations Division



Operational Assignments

- Pre- surveys: Five pre –surveys were completed for businesses within our jurisdiction. The pre-surveys are being sent to Bay County Central Dispatch to be entered into the mapping feature on the iPads onboard the fire apparatus.
- Vehicle Maintenance: No report.
- Small Tools/Equipment Maintenance: Two ventilation chain saws were sent for repair.
- Building Maintenance: A garage door at Station 1 was repaired by M & R Door Company. Exterior lights at Station 1 were updated and repaired.
- Self- Contained Breathing Apparatus (SCBA): 86 SCBA cylinders were filled. 15 air cylinders were removed from service and hydrostatic testing conducted on them with all passing and being placed back into service.
- City- Owned Automatic External Defibrillators (AEDs): All city-owned AED's were accounted for and verified that they are operational and charged.
- Child Care Seat Inspection/Installation: A total of three child safety seats and two over the phone assists were completed in the month of November.
- Uniforms/Personal Protective Equipment (PPE): We continue the 2016-2017 cycle of Personal Protective Equipment inspections and repairs. Another round of PPE has been shipped to Turnout Gear Management, Inc.

- Water/Ice Rescue: The boat motor was run on every Saturday and rescue equipment was checked out.
- Emergency Medical Services (EMS): An Emergency Medical Services (EMS) Quality Assurance Audit was conducted on EMS Incident Reports for the month of October 2016.
- Supplies: Cleaning supplies were ordered for all four fire stations.
- Hose and Hydrants: No report.
- Safety Data Sheets (SDS): All station SDS location sheets have been updated, all SDS notebooks are accounted for in their specific fire station.
- Radios: An internal audit of portable radio inventory was completed and found two portable radios were missing. A Michigan Municipal Risk Management Authority (MMRMA) claim was filed for the missing portable radios.

MUTUAL AID

- There was no Mutual Aid provided during the month of November.

Fire Marshal

- Inspections – 36 inspections were conducted.
- Investigations – 2 fire related investigations were conducted.
- Fire Prevention Programs – There were two programs conducted, one at Bradley House and one at the Health Fair at City Hall.

Fire Incidents Investigated

During the month of November 2016 there were two fire incidents investigated.

- On November 21st, a structure fire on Patterson (undetermined). Investigated by the Fire Marshal and a Detective.
- On November 24th, a structure fire on 18th St (incendiary). Investigated by the Fire Marshal and a Detective.

Departmental Training

Law Enforcement Operations

- On November 2nd & 3rd a corporal attended crash to courtroom/lethal weapon.

Fire Operations

- On November 7th, 10th, 14th and 17th, Full-time Firefighters, Public Safety Officers and Part-Time Paid on Call Firefighters attended eight hour training days on the following topics Apparatus Driving and Apparatus Pumping.
- On November 9th a Captain attended training held by the Bay County Emergency Management Coordinator, with the topic of SARA Title III Emergency Planning & Notification concerning 302 sites (hazardous materials).
- On November 29th, on duty firefighters attended an Active Shooter
