Quality Service Opportunities

First Platoon

- A Public Safety Officer was dispatched to check the well-being of an elderly resident. He found the house was open and learned the subject was at McLaren Hospital. The Public Safety Officer secured the house prior to clearing the call.
- Officers participated in "Shop with a Cop".
- Officers attended "Project Blue Light" ceremony.

Second Platoon

- On December 21st, officers assisted a citizen who had spun out and gotten stuck on Veteran's Memorial Bridge. The driver did not have towing coverage on their insurance or money for a tow truck. Officers assisted the driver by helping her dig out her vehicles, locating some scrap

lumber in a dumpster to use for traction. Officers ended up pushing their vehicle and getting them on their way.

- On December 22nd, a Public Safety Officer and an Officer in Training responded to a check the well-being of an elderly resident. They found that their stairway was covered in ice. They returned and spread salt on the icy stairway.
- On December 27th, an officer responded to a medical call and found a woman with no pulse. He conducted CPR until more advanced medical personnel arrived on scene. The woman developed a heartbeat and survived the incident.
- An officer brought stuffed animals that were given to him by a friend. He handed them out to children that he encountered throughout the week leading up to Christmas.
- Officers attended the “Project Blue Light” ceremony.

Other Agency Assist

First Platoon

- On December 10th, officers assisted deputies from the Bay County Sheriff’s Office with an unruly/combatative subject at McLaren Bay Region Hospital.
- On December 14th, officers assisted the Bay County Sheriff’s Office with a personal injury accident roll over crash at Tuscola Rd. and Kosciuszko Ave.
- On December 16th, a corporal assisted the Department of Treasury with an investigation.
- On December 31st, a Public Safety Officer assisted the Buena Vista Police Department with a recovery of a stolen vehicle.

Second Platoon

- On December 2nd, officers assisted a deputy from the Bay County Sheriff’s Office who requested back- up due to a combative suspect that was caught attempting to steal snow blowers at Tractor Supply Company.

Enforcement Efforts

First Platoon

- On December 16th, a Public Safety Officer and an Officer in Training located a suspect in a shoplifting incident running on foot. After a short pursuit, the suspect obeyed commands and stopped.

Second Platoon

- On December 13th, a Public Safety Officer located a suspect while conducting follow –up on a larceny complaint. She obtained a confession and recovered \$14,000 in cash which was stolen during the incident.
- On December 5th, a Public Safety Officer observed a subject who as acting suspiciously and appeared to be avoiding police contact. The Public Safety Officer contacted the subject who initially gave a false name. Eventually, the Public Safety Officer obtained the subject’s true identity and found he had a parole absconder warrant from Evart, MI.
- On December 9th, officers noticed a subject who was walking on Liberty Bridge while carrying a seven week old baby in 23° weather. Officers made contact with the subject and learned that the man had assaulted his girlfriend in a nearby vehicle and then exited the car taking the baby with him. The subject was arrested for Domestic Assault and the Department of Human Services was contacted to report the child neglect.
- On December 13th, a Public Safety Officer stopped a vehicle for erratic driving and the driver was subsequently arrested for Operating While Intoxicated.

Traffic Enforcement Efforts

First Platoon

- Officers worked traffic enforcement while on patrol for a total of 9 hours and 13 minutes working the following areas: S. Lincoln St., S. Water St., Marquette Ave., Broadway Ave., Madison Ave., S. Henry St., 7th St., S. Lincoln St., and W. Midland St.
- Officers worked a traffic detail in the area of W. Jenny St. and S. Chilson St. Officers issued two citations for speeding.

Second Platoon

- Officers worked traffic enforcement while on patrol for a total of 40 hours and 2 minutes working the following areas: AuSable State St., State St., Marquette Ave., Smith St., Third St., Madison Ave., McKinley St., Vermont St., Henry St., North Union St., Kosciuszko Ave., Farragut St., Michigan Ave., Cass Ave., Garfield Ave, Salzburg Ave., Lafayette Ave., Midland St., Broadway Ave., Wenona Ave., Independence Bridge, Johnson St., Center Ave., and Washington Ave.

Crime Suppression Efforts

First Platoon

- Officers completed 76 park checks, totaling approximately 12 hours and 52 minutes.
- Officers completed 52 actions of “Appeared Secure” for building checks. Officers left door hangers at a total of 13 businesses. Officers recorded business checks totaling approximately 5 hours and 57 minutes spent on checks.
- Officers continued to complete C.O.P. (community oriented policing) stops during their shift.

Second Platoon

- Officers completed 126 park checks, totaling approximately 27 hours and 10 minutes.
- Officers completed 348 actions of “appeared secure” for building checks. Officers left door hangers at a total of 189 businesses. Officers recorded business checks totaling approximately 24 hours and 42 minutes spent on checks.
- Officers are continuing to do C.O.P. (community oriented policing) stops during their shift, totaling 108 for the month.

Reserve Unit Activity

- Four reserve officers attended the Blue Light Ceremony.
- Two reserve officers worked the Santa on Midland Street event.

Detective Bureau Recap

Exceptional Cases Investigated or Cleared by Arrest:

- The Detective Bureau assisted with a fire investigation. The Detective Bureau interviewed the two homeowners and a witness. The Detective Bureau conducted a systematic fire investigation and concluded the fire was accidental.





Fire Operations Division



Operational Assignments

- Pre- surveys: Eleven pre –surveys were completed for businesses within our jurisdiction. The pre-surveys are being sent to Bay County Central Dispatch to be entered into the mapping feature on the iPads onboard the fire apparatus.
- Vehicle Maintenance: No report.
- Small Tools/Equipment Maintenance: A ventilation saw from Engine 1 was repaired and placed back into service. Station 5 got a new 4.5” angel grinder to clean and sharpen tools.
- Building Maintenance: The station alarm system at Station 2 was repaired by Anderson Radio.
- Self- Contained Breathing Apparatus (SCBA): 73 SCBA cylinders were filled. 3 SCBAs were repaired.
- City- Owned Automatic External Defibrillators (AEDs): All city-owned AED’s were accounted for and verified that they are operational and charged. New batteries were purchased and installed in the AED at City Hall.
- Bay County 911 Liaison: Two incident dispatches were investigated for quality assurance.
- Child Care Seat Inspection/Installation: A total of 3 child safety seats were installed in the month of December.

- Uniforms/Personal Protective Equipment (PPE): We continue the 2016-2017 cycle of Personal Protective Equipment inspections and repairs. Another round of PPE has been shipped to Turnout Gear Management, Inc.
- Water/Ice Rescue: The boat motor was run on every Saturday and rescue equipment was checked out.
- Emergency Medical Services (EMS): An Emergency Medical Services (EMS) Quality Assurance Audit was conducted on EMS Incident Reports for the month of November 2016.
- Supplies: Cleaning supplies were inventoried and ordered for all four fire stations.
- Hose and Hydrants: No report.
- Safety Data Sheets (SDS): All station SDS location sheets have been updated.
- Radios: An inventory was completed on all portable radios.
